When was the Battle of Crecy?	1346, July			
Who commanded the English troops at Crecy?	Edward III Edward, the Black Prince Earl of Northampton			
Which ally of Philip VI's was killed at Crecy?	John of Bohemia			
What was the outcome of the Battle of Crecy?	Significant English success			
What is a 'siege'?	Attempt to starve out a town or city			
When did the Battle of Calais happen?	Sept 1346 – August 1347			
What was the outcome of the Battle of Calais?	English victory – the town surrendered to Edward in August 1347			
When did Edward III beat the Scottish King David?	1347			
What Europe wide event halted the conflict of the Hundred Years War?	Black Death			
When did King Philip VI die, and who succeeded him?	1350, King John			
What action did Edward the Black Prince take in 1355?	Led a chevauchee through the south of France			
When was the Battle of Poitiers?	1356, Sept			
What was the outcome of the Battle of Poitiers?	English victory. King John captured and several French nobles killed.			
What did the French agree to in 1360?	Treaty of Bretigny			
Why did the French have no choice but to agree to the Treaty of Bretigny?	No money Internal rebellion – instability Lack of popular support for war Lack of leadership			
What were the terms of the Treaty of Bretigny?	English granted land in SW France English no longer had to pay homage Edward renounced his claim to the French throne King John ransomed for 3 million gold coins			
What happened to King John?	Unable to raise ransom money Returned to England Died in prison, 1364
