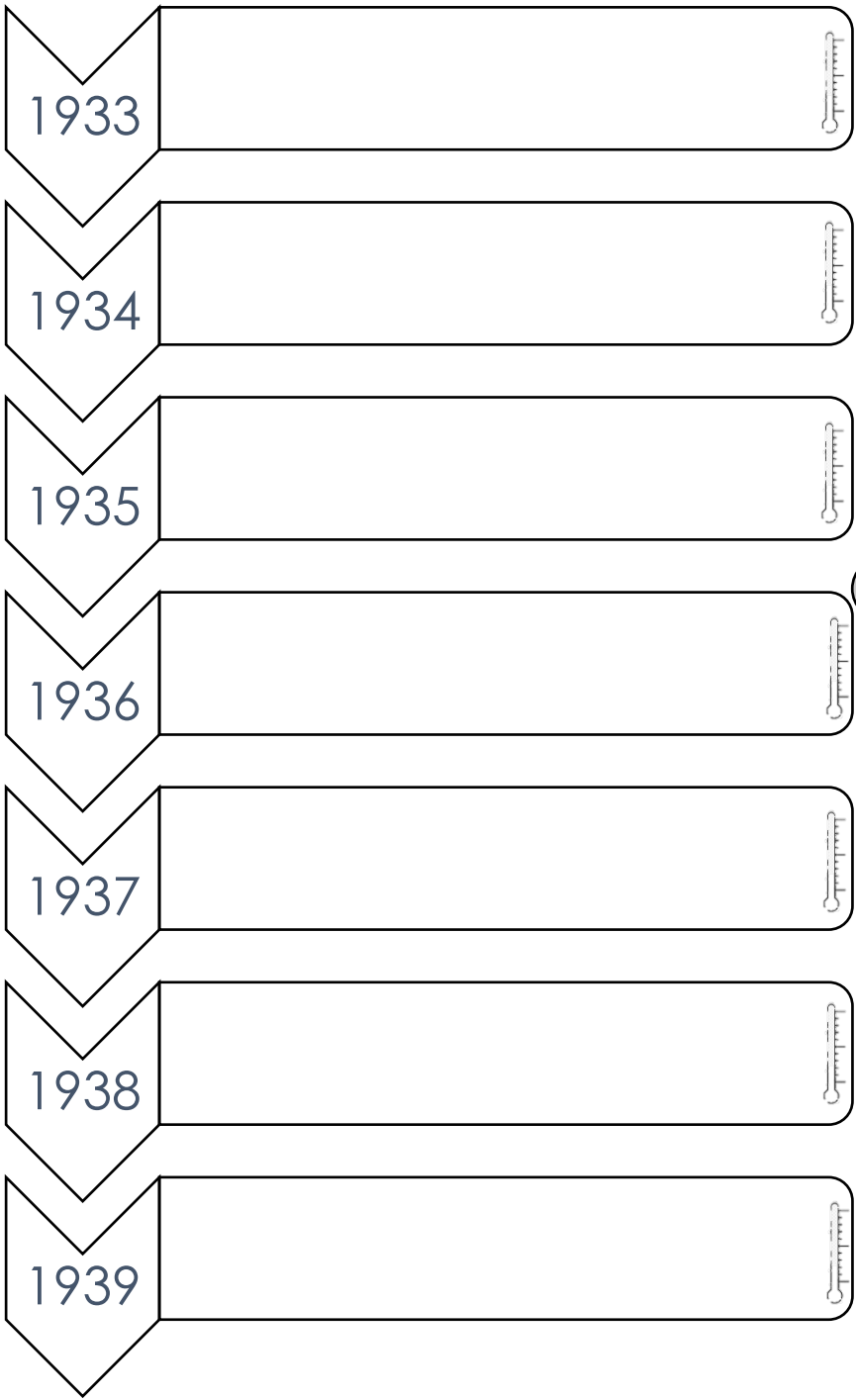

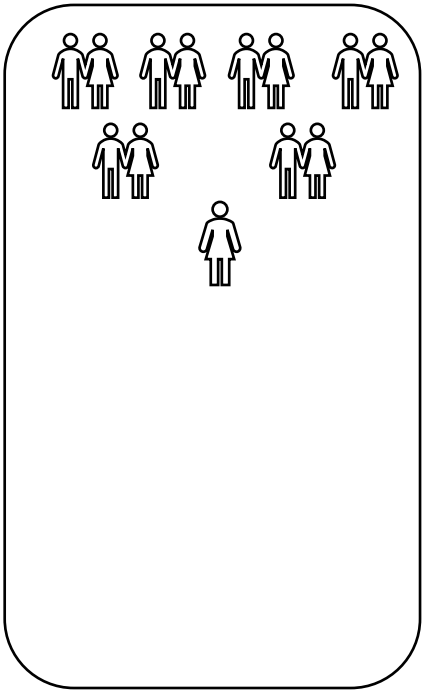

Aftermath

The Reich Law on Citizenship	The Reich Law for the Protection of German Blood and Honour
Stated only those of German blood could be German citizens	Jews lost the right to vote or hold government office or German passports
Jews became German 'subjects' not citizens	This law forbade Jews from marrying German citizens
It also forbade sexual relations between Jews and German citizens	Jews were required to wear a yellow star-shaped patch sewn onto their clothes, so German citizens could easily recognise them
Marriages that had occurred before this law were still considered legal .	German citizens were encouraged to divorce their existing Jewish partners. Few did.
